Report on Mobilization of NRNA Mobile Blood Bus after Handover (Baishakh to Asar 2081)

Introduction and Description:

During the period from Baishakh to Asar 2081, the Nepal Red Cross Society Sunsari, Dhanusha and Banke District Chapter successfully mobilized the NRNA Mobile Blood Bus to facilitate blood collection across various provinces. The quarterly report indicates the following:

Koshi Province: Blood collection conducted by NRCS Sunsari District Chapter located in Dharan, Sunsari, Koshi Province amounted to 451 units, comprising 323 from males and 128 from females.

Madhesh Province: NRCS Dhanusha District Chapter, located in Janakpur, Dhanusha, Madhesh Province contributed 457 units of blood, with 418 units collected from males and 39 units from females.

Lumbini Province: The NRCS Banke District Chapter, situated in Nepalgunj, Banke, Lumbini Province achieved significant blood collection, totaling 525 units. This comprised 415 units from males and 110 units from females.

Total Collection:

Across the three provinces, a combined total of 1,257 units of blood were collected during the specified period. This includes 974 units from males and 283 units from females.
